PURCHASE REQUESTS:

R. Smith presented the following resolution:

1. Resolution to Purchase One New Model Year 2018 AWD Utility Police Interceptor Vehicle for the Madison County Coroner's Office.

Mr. Asadorian moved, seconded by Ms. Ciampoli, to approve the purchase request as presented. The ayes and nays being called on the motion to approve resulted in a vote as follows: AYES: Wesley, Parkinson, Asadorian, Kuhn and Ciampoli. NAYS: None.

J. Connor presented the following resolution:

1. Resolution to Purchase Ten New Model Year 2018 Police Utility AWD Replacement Vehicles for the Madison County Sheriff's Office.

CORONER:

L. Ciampoli asked R. Smith if there is still an increase on heroin and opioid overdoses. R. Smith did reply yes, he said they are between 20-24 deaths for the year.

SHERIFF:

J. Connor reported to the committee a new program will be starting up called "Leads Online." It is an online program that pawn brokers and second hand shops would report to. They would generate a receipt on this program and it will automatically come to the sheriff's department and local police departments. This helps find stolen items that could be pawned. The sheriff's department is moving towards an ordinance to require businesses that report to the sheriff's department to go to this new online program.

L. Ciampoli inquired about the Sheriff Work Program. J. Connor informed the committee the program is still in effect and working well.

LICENSE INVESTIGATOR:

J. Zoelzer presented 2 liqueur licenses, one for Bottom's Up Bar and Grill and the other is for Quikstop Gas Raceway.
